- The Graduate College policy requires students to complete the program within five years of their first enrollment term.
- NURS 568 and NURS 569 must be taken in sequence. NURS 569 must be taken in the quarter immediately following NURS 568. Each practicum course contains 80 practicum hours. Students will be eligible to start the practicum preparation process approximately 6 months before the start of the course.
